COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to introduce the student to great movements in art history from the High Renaissance through contemporary art. Art of the 20th century is emphasized.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The student completing this course will be able to:

1. Provide written descriptions of major works of art such as Western Civilization from the Renaissance to the present.
2. Critically analyze artifacts from the Renaissance to the present.
3. Describe how various art styles reflect the time period and society in which they were popular.
4. Express how art of the past helps to shape culture.

MEASURABLE OUTCOMES

1. To study major works of art from the renaissance to the present. To understand and be able to discuss the major style of art/architecture in the stated time period above.
2. By the end students will demonstrate college level master in 60% of exams and discussion on the history of art from the renaissance to the present.
3. By the end students will demonstrate college level mastery in 60% of exams and discussions, which require an understanding of the history of art from the Renaissance to the present.
