COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to introduce students to the fundamental techniques of color mixing and application in acrylic painting and to help develop skills necessary for the more sophisticated problems of conveying mood and feeling.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of this course the student will:

1. Employ the properties of color (hue, value, chroma) in a painting.
2. Employ the visual elements to create mood and feeling in a painting + principles of design.
3. Demonstrate a competency with the basic tools and materials of painting.

1. Student will demonstrate through holistic evaluation college level mastery of the properties of color in 60% of the work assigned.
